Barb Fuller: County and state fair are done. Child Care provider training held last night in Corning, with 7 in attendance. Funded by Quad Counties ECI grant. Nature Explore program will be held in Creston on October 15 at Trinity Lutheran Church. Open to any early childhood professionals.

Kristie Nixon: 8/29 Roll and Read event in Greenfield, families with children 0 to age 5, walking event with 2 guest readers along the way, children will receive a book. This will also be held in Adams County in September, TBA date and location. ECE conference on 11/5 at SWCC, Jeff Johnson is the keynote speaker. October 17, Family literacy night in Creston. PAT has 5 families in Corning.
