# FY20 Budget

The Coalition was provided with a budget update, to date 24% of the funds have been expended. Deb reiterated that if the funds are not spent by the end of the fiscal year, they are returned to the funder.

### Presentation

The presentation from Connections Area Agency on Ageing was postponed until the December 5, 2019 meeting.

### **Violence Prevention Grant Planning**

Deb Schrader shared 5 years of data from the <u>Iowa Department of Education</u> on unilateral removals (suspension and expulsions). In 2018 there were 24 removals for Bedford, 65 removals for Southwest Valley and 35 removals for Lenox. There were 424 children enrolled in Bedford, 424 for Corning and 480 for Lenox schools. At first glance it appears the removals are high in Southwest Valley. Data from the <u>Iowa Department of Public Health called the Iowa YRBS</u> snapshot was reviewed, this is statewide data. Bulling and sexual violence are higher than the national average. It has been challenging to find reliable data that would fit the violence prevention grant. Data was also shared regarding the % of Adams and Taylor County person 65 and older, Adams county has 22%-23% and Taylor county has 21%-22% compared to the state of Iowa at 17% and the United States is 16%. Brittany Shinn provided data from Crisis Intervention & Advocacy regarding domestic violence. She is currently in conversation with Adams County law enforcement to get data on 911 calls. She has been unsuccessful with Taylor County law enforcement but will continue to try engage them. More work will continue over the next few months in gathering data to help show the need.
