**COVID Update**

Currently there are 109 long term care facilities with COVID outbreaks, the 7 day infection rate for Iowa is 18.5%, Adams County is 21% and Taylor County is 16%. The highest in the state is 28% in Jefferson County.

Taylor County Public Health and Matura provided an overview of the 1<sup>st</sup> Five program. They are collaborating to apply for a 1<sup>st</sup> Five grant that covers a new region the will serve several counties.

### Budget Updates

*Resiliency Grant* – This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> and final year of the grant, to date 44% of \$168,260 in funding has been expended.

*Violence Prevention Grant and Healthy Communities Grant* – This is the first year of the grant, to date 40.4% of \$86,000 has been expended.

### FY23-FY25 MMF Violence Prevention Grant

Deb participated in a webinar that outlines the grant criteria for FY23; she will be writing the grant in the next few weeks and it is due March 4, 2022.

### FY22 Midyear Reports

A midyear report is due to Mission and Ministry fund by March 11, 2022. The three year implementation grant has met or exceeded most aspects of the benchmarks and the violence prevention grant also has met or exceeded aspect of the benchmarks. It is anticipated that both grants will have 100% expended. Reports are located in the Google folder.

- ZION Prevention Specialists have presented information on marijuana to 75 individuals throughout Area 13, (to include Adams and Taylor Counties) as well as handed out information on marijuana to 75 individuals.
