### Review of Meeting Minutes

The minutes of the May 2, 2024 meeting were reviewed and were accepted.

### CHI Health Mercy Corning Community Health Needs Assessment Presentation

Lucia Rodrigues Alvizo provided an overview of the needs assessment the hospital is required to complete. PRC will be contracted to conduct much of the needs assessment and data. Information will be available in the spring.

### Agency Updates

- Lisa Carstens, Certified Prevention Specialist at ZION Integrated Behavioral Health Services - Prevention specialists continue to share and distribute information regarding the Savor Every Moment Media Campaign that focuses on adult binge drinking in Adams County and the Be #1 at Getting Help Media Campaign that focuses on adult problem gambling in Taylor County. As for implementing workplace policies regarding gambling, we have been working with a few different businesses and companies in both Adams & Taylor Counties; however, only one has signed to date in each county. I have also attached a copy of the Summer Tips Flyer that shares information regarding alcohol, tobacco and marijuana.
- Lucia Rodriguez will be resigning in August to attend school at Berkley.
- SWCC had a baby shower in Taylor County and served 27 families.

### FY24 Mission and Ministry Violence Prevention Grant Update

Brittany Shinn reported all grant goals have been met for FY24 and that CIAC has drawn down all allotted funding.

The FY24 CHI Health Mission and Ministry Violence Prevention grant is \$53,300 and Healthy Communities funding is \$16,000 of which 100% of grant funds have been expended for the fiscal year.

### Health & Human Services Department Alignment Efforts

A collective impact survey was conducted all the responses were all positive and mirror results from previous surveys. This information will be utilized in the Mission and Ministry annual report.

**Child Abuse Data**

2023 child abuse data was shared with the group; Adams County had 8 children abused/neglected and Taylor County had 20 children.
